NCyTE members who have not yet participated in the two-day virtual introduction to the Cybersecurity Maturity Model Certification (CMMC) should consider [registering online](#) as soon as possible for the next available workshop, Thursday and Friday, February 11-12, 2021.

Previous CMMC workshops have filled to capacity, so NCyTE has added additional opportunities to meet the demand.

The two-day virtual workshop is taught by Professor John Sands of Moraine Valley Community College in Chicago, who is also the Principal Investigator and Director of the Center for Systems Security and Information Assurance (CSSIA). Funded by a grant from the National Science Foundation, the workshop is free.

Cybersecurity Competitions: Value and Benefits for Students and Faculty

The NCyTE Member Webinar on Friday, February 19, at 9 a.m. Pacific time, will focus on cybersecurity competitions and the role they play nationwide in helping students grow their cybersecurity skills.

Guest speaker Dr. Dan Manson is the commissioner and co-founder of the [National Cybersecurity League](#) (NCL), a biannual competition open to U.S. high school and college students.

Dr. Manson will discuss the educational benefits of using NCL materials and challenges either as part of an existing class or when coaching an NCL student team. He will also discuss other competitions open to U.S. students, like the [National Collegiate Cyber Defense Competition](#) (CCDC) and the Air Force Association's [CyberPatriot](#) competition for high school and middle school students.
