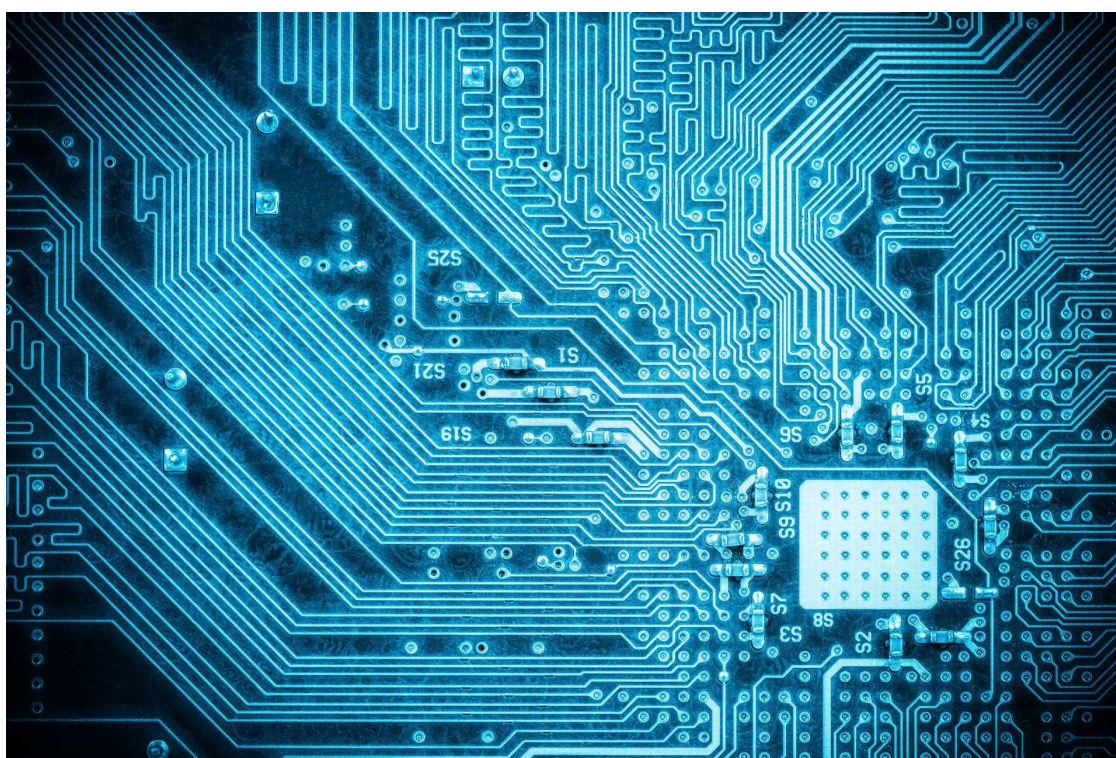
Centers of Academic Excellence – an Information Session
