NCyTE representatives spent part of cybersecurity awareness month at three national events.

At the AISES (American Indian Science & Engineering) conference, Michele Robinson, NCyTE Senior Director, and Stephen Miller, NCyTE Co-PI, connected with students, instructors, and administrators. They are happy to report that 2024 will have programming that will include ideas and connections from the conference.

NCyTE and Microsoft Philanthropies hosted a Tribal Colleges Community of Practice Workshop. The workshop kicked off a series of workshops that provide a platform to explore funding opportunities and services that can enhance classroom instruction and/or assist in developing cyber programs. Participants will get to engage in discussions, share best practices, and collaborate with colleagues from other tribal colleges.

At the ATE (Advanced Technological Education) PI Conference, the NCyTE team included Michele Robinson, Stephen Troupe, Tony Coulson, Stephen Miller, and John Sands.
